Group A – Emerging Enterprise
This award recognises:
i) products, services or processes that is creative, unique and of economic / social value, or
ii) an up and coming enterprise that has been in business for less than 24 months or has an annual revenue of less than S\$1,000,000.

Group B – Emerging Entrepreneur
This award is open to all individuals who are either self-employed / current employees of a firm, that have exhibited entrepreneurial traits namely, innovativeness, proactiveness and risk-taking and have demonstrated the ability to identify and exploit new / untapped opportunities leading to the creation of economic / social value. The uniqueness of this category is that it recognises social entrepreneurs i.e. those who demonstrate a commitment to champion a social cause.

Group C – Emerging Malay / Muslim Entrepreneur
This award is open to all individuals in the Malay / Muslim community who are either self-employed / current employees of a firm that have exhibited entrepreneurial traits namely, innovativeness, proactiveness and risk-taking and have demonstrated the ability to identify and exploit commercial opportunities leading to the creation of economic value.

Group D – Emerging Young Entrepreneur
This award is open to all individuals below the age of 40 years old, who are either self-employed / current employees of a firm that have exhibited entrepreneurial traits namely innovativeness, proactiveness and risk-taking and have demonstrated the ability to identify and exploit commercial opportunities leading to the creation of economic value.

Group E – Innovative Industrial Infocomm Initiatives
This award is open to all enterprises that have successfully implemented an industrial infocomm initiative, which is defined as an initiative that leads to greater operational productivity and efficiency while incurring no increase in operational cost.

Group F – Student Professional Profiling Award
This award is open to all institutions of higher learning (e.g. ITE, polytechnics and universities students). This award is to engage students with professional subjects from working career professionals in the corporate world to founders of small and medium enterprises and start-up entrepreneurs.

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Student Professional Profiling Award

Nature of Award

This is going to be an annual competition, organized by Republic Polytechnic. Through this competition, we hope to promote professional profiling to student from both ITE and IHL, as a way to gain in depth knowledge and insight from the subject of their study.

Background on Professional Profiling

Professional Profiling is to engage students with professional subjects from working career professionals in the corporate world to founders of small and medium enterprises and start-up entrepreneurs.

It prepares students to take personal responsibility in their growth and development and inculcate a sense of knowledge in personal fulfilment and effective career management.

Scope and Requirements

The subject of study can be:

- An individual – either as an entrepreneur or a professional; or
- A profession; or
- A company or a department; or
- An industry.

The scope of the subject profiled is not limited. However it should include the subject's background, successes/challenges, motivation, attitudes, personality, as well as the influence of the environment. The profiling can be done at a cross section of time where the subject is compared against others with similar traits or across a period of time showing the subject's progress / trends.

At the end of the profiling, participants are required to prepare a report demonstrating understanding of the subject's characteristics and achievements, as well as any insights students have gained from their profiling exercise.

Rules and Regulations

Eligibility

This competition is open to all institutions of higher learning e.g. ITE, polytechnic and university students.

Submission Requirements

Participants are each required to submit their profiling report. (The report should be at least 2,000 words, (maximum 8,000 words) excluding pictures, tables, and other supporting commentaries or illustrations.

If the participant is short-listed, he or she would have a week to prepare a static information booth to display their profiled subject to a minimum of 3 judges. Participants need not be present when the judging process takes place. The display of the information Booth will be hosted in Republic Polytechnic.

Profiling Report

The profiling report will be selected based on the following points.

Category / Judging Criteria

Subject selected (10%)

- Covers area of interest, challenges, insights gain, report will also be judged based on clarity and accuracy of information.

Relevance (20%)

- Addresses the profiling objectives.

Research (20%)

- Evidence of secondary and primary studies. The ability to distinguish between facts and opinion, clarity and accuracy of the subject matter.

Originality (10%)

- View and analysis of the subject profiled.

Presentation (40%)

- The findings, understanding and learning presented in a logical and convincing manner.
